To Whom It May Concern:

At this present time Mr. Delsman has not been scheduled for any surgery, surgery date is pending until a second opinion is completed. Mr. Delsman has explained to me that the delay in his ability to make a surgical time decision was based on his report that GE had terminated his pay in early April for more than three months and his health insurance in June, so he was unable to make any commitments regarding further medical intervention during this time.

Mr. Delsman also states that his children will be returning to school in late August and the resulting medical delays have created a situation whereby Mr. Delsman will be separated from his family while facing major thoracic surgery and recovery time alone.

Current Symptoms

At present, Mr. Delsman is experiencing a multitude of symptoms related to his conditions. These symptoms include acute and chronic pain, sleep disturbances, fatigue and weakness of the extremities neurological impairment, decreased motor function, acute temperature sensitivity and overall stress. Patient has difficulty doing much physical activity and rests a lot. Multiple symptoms related to spinal injuries: moderate to severe pain, acute and chronic of neck and weakness of muscles in arm and shoulders, moderate stress relating to his cancelled insurance, depression at not getting referral and

surgery done. He is unable to be involved in his usual and customary employment with GE. He can at time of an emergency answer questions from home with GE customers.

Mr. Delsman is totally disabled at this time. He is unable to work until he complete the medical intervention and recovery process.
